## **SOUTH AFRICA TO BE REPRESENTED AT THE 2010 IFAA WORLD FIELD ARCHERY CHAMPIONSHIPS**

On Friday, 16 July 2010 the National Protea Colours were awarded to 25 archers of the SANIFAA who will be representing South Africa at the IFAA World Field Archery Championships (WFAC) in Dahn, Germany. The awards ceremony took place at the Waterkloof Golf Club in Pretoria and was attended by 110 guests from as far as Cape Town and Polokwane.

The Protea archers and their guests were welcomed in the foyer by the 2010 WFAC Protea Team Manager, Marietjie Fryer, and helped themselves to some welcoming sherry to brush away the chilly Highveld weather before they proceeded to the Albatros hall.



The Field Vice President, Zack Benade welcomed all to this most prestigious event in the history of SANIFAA and invited all to dine on the plated starter before he handed over to the SANIFAA President.



The SANIFAA President, Stefan van der Linde, reminded all of the significance of this year's awards ceremony. This is the largest group in the history of SANIFAA that will be participating in a World Field Archery Championships. Apart from the 24 Protea archers in 12 different styles a further 9 archers will be representing a SANIFAA Team entry. A total contingent of 38 South Africans, which also includes supporters of the Protea Team, will depart for Germany on the 27<sup>th</sup> of July 2010.

At the 2008 WFAC South Africa came home with no less than 22 medals of which 11 were GOLD. The current Field World Champions in the Free Style and Bowhunter, junior and senior styles are from South Africa and will therefore set their goal to defend their titles.

The SANIFAA President emphasized the honor that are been identified with the recognition and the awarding of National Protea Colours. Each archer who is receiving his/her Protea Colours earned it with hard work and dedication to the sport of archery. He urged each team member to wear it with pride and honor and to make South Africa, Archery South Africa and SANIFAA proud.

## “Great score from South Africa

Lausanne – 15 July 2010

Seppie CILLIERS at Antalya 2010 World Cup

**On 10-11 July 2010 at the Claudette Shiers Tournament in Durban, South Africa the compound archer Seppie CILLIERS shot a superb score of 1418 points (349 at 90m, 351 at 70m, 358 at 50m, and 360 at 30m). This performance is only one point behind the world record held by Peter ELZINGA from the Netherlands.**



CILLIERS already became a member of the very exclusive FITA International 1400 Club and the second South African archer to break this mythical barrier (after Nick BENADE, 1405 points in January 2000) last year when he shot 1407 at the same Claudette Shiers Tournament. He also holds the 30m world record with 360 points and 33 X10.

# **SANAA PRESIDENT'S CYCLE COMES TO AN END AT ARCHERY SOUTH AFRICA**

Archery South Africa is the governing body of the sport in South Africa and is the direct link between government and the sport.

The Constitution of Archery South Africa requires that the Presidents of SANAA and SANIFAA rotate the presidency, and at the Archery SA Congress held in Johannesburg held late in June, I handed over the reigns of the sport to Stefan van der Linde, the current President of SANIFAA.

I did so knowing that Stefan would take the sport to the next level and with the knowledge that he would continue to have the ongoing support of both SASCO and the Ministry of Sport. In terms of the Archery SA Constitution, I take the role of Vice President of the national federation.

Over the past four years I have fought hard for the rights of archers, have attended numerous meetings with the authorities, spent many hours in Parliament and met many interesting and varied people.

It was indeed a privilege to serve in such a position, but now that my cycle is over, I can return my full focus to SANAA and concentrate on my passion; that of development and grass roots archery; much of which you will hear in the months to come under the leadership of our national development coordinator, Alan Weyers.

To that end, I have asked The Editor to publish my 2010 Archery SA President's report, which was accepted by the annual Archery SA Congress;

I would like to take the opportunity of using our official publication, The SA Archer, to thank all those who supported me during my tenure and look forward to assisting and supporting SANIFAA as Vice President of Archery SA in growing the sport even further.

## **2010 President's Report Archery South Africa**

This is my fourth year since I started my rotational presidency of Archery South Africa, an honour of great significance as my vision outlined in the four-year-plan

at the time was greeted with scepticism and the realisation that there would be some hard work ahead.

But it was the support of the national associations that proved that we could grow and organise our sport. I am pleased to report that we were able to implement many projects concerning the growth and development of our great sport and would briefly like to discuss some of the points of the plan and the progress that we have made over the past year.

### **International Recognition**

Our standing amongst the international federations has improved in all areas. Not only has this been of advantage to our archers, but to the country as a whole. The public events have allowed others to see how exciting and thrilling our sport is, whether it be in high performance with medals brought back to South Africa by SANIFAA and SANAA members; international accolades by the ABO or the involvement of over 5,000 school children involved in the NASP programme. Our national associations remain recognised by the International Federations for the excellent work that they have been doing.

### **The Four-Year Plan**

In the space of one year, the number of people participating in our sport has increased exponentially. Our four-year plan was created when there were less than 1,000 registered archers on the member registers. Today, that has changed, and with the assistance of grants from various organisations, and with the spirit of volunteerism, we have managed to take the sport to areas never before imagined possible, and made it accessible to all who wish to participate. There has been a significant growth in certain provinces, and many more clubs in which the sport can be practiced. Much of this has to do with the outcome of the funding received from SRSA

### **New Office Organisation**

As we close our 60th year as a formal organisation, it has become apparent that the sport can no longer function properly and sustain its growth without a full time office. The demands from the international federations, various sports authorities, member associations, provincial sports bodies and members have forced this necessity. No longer can we act as a group of volunteers without a central office and at minimal, a secretary. It is for this reason that in the new

financial year, an application will be made to central government to assist us with a grant to establish such an office.

## **Constitution**

With the growth that we have experienced in the past year, it has been necessary for us to look at our Constitution and Rules and to project its usefulness for the next 20 years. To this end, the founder members of Archery South Africa convened with the volunteer services of Dirk van Niekerk, an attorney of good standing and accomplished archer and over the months between our last Congress in May 2009 and October 2009 formulated a new framework. At a meeting of national association presidents in November, all the articles were voted on and passed. This has resulted in a new and fair constitution that embraces all archer associations of South Africa; both in the present and the future.

## **Mass Participation Programme**

One of our goals at the start of the last year was to bring archery to the masses and to make it more accessible to all. At our last Congress it was agreed that the mechanism to achieve this goal would be through the National Archery in Schools Programme (NASP). I am pleased to report that under the capable leadership of Wilhelm Greeff, the goal has been achieved, and our great sport is now active in previously disadvantaged areas. While financial constraints have prevented NASP from implementing the various programmes on the scale envisaged, it is nevertheless successful to the extent that talent identification at NASP level will be filtered through to both SANIFAA and SANAA.

## **Disabled Archery**

In 2007 the International Disabled Association advised us that disabled archery would be incorporated into the mainstream of FITA archery. Catherine van Zijl was tasked to handle this matter in conjunction with the SA Sports for the Physically Disabled. I am pleased to report that the integration is now fully complete and that to this end FITA has approved a new class of "Para-Archery" recognising the following categories:

Recurve Women W1 RWW1

Recurve Men W2 RMW 2

Recurve Men W1 RMW1  
Recurve Women Standing RWS

Compound Women Open CWO

Visually Impaired Men MVI

A grant from Sport & Recreation (SRSA) South Africa has allowed the identification of a previously disadvantaged school for talent for participation in future events. It is relevant to mention that in April this year, Anton Pierre Swart shot a Paralympics qualifier.

### **National Events**

Four national associations have hosted successful national championships this past year. The standing of South African archers has resulted in a number of international participants in these tournaments contributing towards sports tourism. In one provincial event alone, some 10 international archers participated. We also contributed to sports-tourism with over 100 international archers participating in local events.

### **International Events**

A number of international events were hosted, including the Continental Championships. Detailed reports appear in the SA Archer. These events were able to be hosted due to grants from SRSA.

### **Medals**

The improvement in the standard of our sport has grown significantly, to the extent that South Africa has returned home with more medals than ever before. Recognition must be given to the member association secretaries who have played a vital role in the preparation, training and selection process leading up

to our medal collection. Amongst them, winning the 2<sup>nd</sup> Leg of the World Archery Cup Team event.

## **Coaching**

A lack of funding and local skills has not seen the vision of growing our coaches capacity as we would have liked to have seen. Notwithstanding this limitation, in the past year we have had a number of international coaches (both Compound and Recurve) coach both local coaches and archers. I am also pleased to advise that a joint initiative by SANAA and SANIFAA resulted in coach Park running a course with the aim of building coaching capacity and to equip at least each province with one qualified coach.

## **Coaching Contracts**

A formal coaching contract has been put in place by SANAA where provincial coaches who have benefitted from the international exposure undertake to train club coaches, thereby increasing the coaching standards and ability at club level.

## **Judging**

South Africa remains in good standing with the International Federations with regard to national, continental and international judges. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate two SANAA volunteers on passing their examinations in Germany and being appointed as International Judge Candidates.

## **International Field Archery Association**

The Congress of FITA and the World Council of IFAA has agreed to a Memorandum of Mutual Acknowledgment where both parties agree to recognize each other as independent sports organizations and to respect doping bans on athletes by either party, based on the WADA defined antidoping rules

Furthermore it has been agreed that both parties will continue to jointly

- (a) standardize rules related to archery equipment;
- (b) cooperate on activities to promote archery as a sport;
- (c) develop safety recommendations for field and 3D ranges;

- (d) lobby jointly for privileged air transport terms and conditions related to archery equipment and the conservation of the legal status of owning, handling and using archery equipment;
- (e) Have joint field events

Archery SA welcomes this cooperation cooperation between the two archery organisations. Both have different visions and objectives for the respective organisations, which is why both have a reason to exist.

Both SANIFAA and SANAA will comply with the spirit of the agreement, as there will be a joint objective to develop the sport of Archery further by working together in certain domains. This includes matters such as equipment rules, safety and legal requirements, travel with archery equipment, development initiatives and any other matters of common interest.

### **Joint Calendar**

With the incorporation of ABO, SABA and NASP as provisional members of Archery SA (to be ratified at Congress 2010), the number of events which could lead to conflict has resulted in the tasking of a committee that would regulate and coordinate the Archery SA Official Calendar. It is hoped such a move would avoid conflict and give all archers an opportunity to make their own choice of events.

### **WADA**

Archery SA subscribes to the rules of WADA and during the past year has appointed a committee to deal with a matter which was sanctioned by the SA Institute of Drug Free Sport.

### **Funding**

Archery SA has received funding from SRSA that was utilised for basic administrative functions. A grant advised in 2009 earmarked for further administration, hosting and disabled archery had not been received at the time of writing this report. Note: At time of printing the grant was received and accounted for in the annual financial statements.

## **Media TV**

During the past year we have had a substantial amount of TV and media coverage. Archery South Africa would like in particular to thank JJ van Rensburg for his contribution towards the various programmes that were aired on TV. The additional exposure has not had the desired effect of attracting sponsors, all the more reason for a national coordinated full-time office.

## **Legacy**

Due to a grant by SRSA in the last financial year, a significant legacy was left after the pre-Commonwealth games event, insofar that it benefited local archers and afforded local temporary employment. The Tshwane area now has an archery range, available for use by all member associations, provincial associations and schools.

## **Liaison with Government**

Archery SA presented its plans to SRSA and has a good working relationship with the Ministry on all levels. In particular, I would like to single out Mandy van der Laan and Phiko Mbuqe, the senior sport and recreation coordinators for their contribution towards the sport.

## **SA Sports Confederation and Olympic Committee**

Archery SA has a seat on the SASCOC Presidents Council, and despite this position, has informed SASCOC of its disappointment in liaison and the ability to take decisions which impact on the sport. There are a number of outstanding issues to which the SASCOC board has not responded to at the time of writing this report. One example is the participation of archery in the Commonwealth Games. SASCOC has been informed that it takes at least a year to train and prepare archers, and is well aware of the two medals that FITA archers have won at world events in 2009. Yet, it has not as yet advised us whether archery will be participating in the games. The national association has limited funds and is unable to find direction until such a decision by SASCOC is forthcoming. Note: At the time of printing, permission has been granted for participation in the Commonwealth Games.

## **Provincial Colours**

Archery SA is in favour of the formation of the Provincial Sports Councils, which has amended its rules to the extent that it is the responsibility of the National Federations to award Provincial Colours. We have raised objections to this clause insofar that we believe it should be the responsibility of the member association's provincial bodies to award colours.

## **Provincial Associations**

Due to a grant from SRSA, the founder members have agreed to formulate a plan which will educate and build the capacity of provincial secretaries. The plan includes a membership drive and aims to grow the membership of all member associations.

## **Volunteers**

A number of volunteer initiatives have been put in place over the past year, including the publication of a booklet guiding national associations, provincial associations and clubs of the worth of volunteers. Archery SA notes that recognition is being given to volunteers in the official publication as well as through associations web sites and awards. On behalf of the national federation, I would like to thank the national association's volunteers for their dedication, hard work and spirit of giving.

## **Auditors**

The books of the National Federation are audited vigorously and as we deal with public funding, the auditors need extra requirements. The current auditors are Moore Stephens BKV who offer their services on a pro-bono basis. I would like to thank them for their contribution to the sport.

## **SA Archer**

Special thanks must go to Charmaine Ho, the editor of our official monthly magazine that allows the national associations to disseminate their news to their members. The electronic circulation of the magazine is fully implemented and enjoys a wide circulation to all member associations.

## **Conclusion**

Finally, I would like to thank all Officials, Congress delegates, Council members, elected committee members and volunteers for their great efforts, contributions and harmony in Archery SA. This has been very important for our success.

I must also thank you for the trust you have placed in me as the president of Archery South Africa. It is an honour and privilege to be associated with this great organisation and to work with so many of you as we work to further our goals. As my Constitutional cycle comes to an end, I hand the presidency of the national federation over to SANIFAA, together with my full support in the knowledge that the future of our great sport is in capable hands.

Over the years I have seen various forms of addressing targets by archers – and this is always dependant on whether the archer is shooting well or not so it was fascinating to watch how the Kyudo archers address the target before and after shooting their 6 arrows – bowing to the target and showing such respect irrespective of the result.

Monetary donations were made by the majority of the archers present whilst others donated clothing, magazines and toys. A sum of R1 700,00 was raised. The monetary and other donations were handed over to Cotlands on Saturday, 24 July 2010..

## FIELD ARCHERY

### What is Field Archery?



Field Archery is all about fun. Archers that have not had the pleasure of shooting a field round often think of it as standing at a stake in an open field and shooting at a yonder target. Not so! A field round is a challenging course, generally placed in a woods, in varying terrain, at different distances from target to target.

Field archery is where champions learn how to shoot. It is a proven fact that a proficient field archer is also a proficient 3-D and target archer.



There are a few basic differences between field archery and most 3-D courses. Most notably, that field courses have marked yardages. Field archery is a game of shooting - not yardage estimation. The basic SANIFAA field round is made up of 28 targets. The round is two 14 targets units. There can be 28 targets one after the other, or you can have a 14 target course and shoot it twice to make the round. Each 14 target unit has the same shots, but not necessarily in the same order, on a 28 target field course. You shoot four arrows at each target, so you shoot a total of 112 arrows per field and hunter rounds.

Some of the shooting positions let you shoot all four arrows from one marked stake; some shooting positions have stakes at four different positions where you walk toward the target on each shot, or in a fan position.

The distances vary according to the round you are shooting. The standard IFAA field round has distances that vary from 20 feet to 240 feet (80 Yards). There are four different size faces, the further the target, the bigger the target. The idea is that it teaches you to aim at a spot and will make a better all around archer out of you. Now the younger folks get a break. If you're under 15, your

longest distance is 50 yards; if you're under 12, the longest range is 30 yards. Targets are round, black and white faces. There is a possible 20 points per target and a perfect round is 560.

Other types of "field" rounds are offered, too. There's the hunter round, something like the above field round except that you shoot at an all black face with a white dot. The ranges on this round vary between 33 feet (11 Yards) and 210 feet (70 Yards). Again, 2 fourteen target units make a round. There are four size faces to shoot at and different distances on the roving course. Scoring is identical to the field round.

The animal round is shoot one a year at the Field nationals. The animal round is much like the 3-D round but the targets are 2-D, that is, an animal printed on a sheet of paper that is usually pasted to cardboard. Once again, distances are marked to give everyone an equal chance. Scoring is a bit different on this round. You take three of your arrows and mark them 1, 2, and 3. When you get to the shooting stake you shoot arrow number 1. If you hit the scoring area you need not shoot another arrow. If you miss the first shot you move up to the next shooting stake and shoot number 2. If you hit the scoring zone there's no need to shoot number 3. If you missed number one and two, move up and shoot number three. Scoring is based on where you hit with which arrow.

### **3-D TARGET ARCHERY**

SANIFAA introduced the bow hunter division amongst their archers in 1995, and brought together a new species of archery within SANIFAA. 3D Target Archery is shot on paper targets and three dimensional rubber animals.

SANIFAA is proud to rename bow hunter division to 3-D Target Archery. For the first time 3-D target archers could also compete for Provincial, National colours and Protea colors. In the past years SANIFAA have sent quite a number of Protea archer's to various World Championship Tournaments to compete among some of the world's best 3-D target archers and South Africa has always done well.



## What is 3D Target Archery?

3-D Target Archery is all about judging distances to various targets (2-D & 3-D).

A 3-D Target course consist of fourteen 3-D rubber animals and fourteen 2-D paper targets, witch gives a total of 28 targets.

The 14 x 2-D targets are placed in groups to help the archer with judging distances:

- ◆Group 1 targets at marked distances varying from 60 yards down to 40 yards.
- ◆Group 2 targets at marked distances varying from 45 yards down to 30 yards.
- ◆Group 3 targets at marked distances varying from 35 yards down to 20 yards.
- ◆Group 4 targets at marked distances varying from 20 yards down to 10 yards.

Scoring zones are drawn onto these targets, scoring ten points in the high zone with eight and five points respectively in the lower scoring area. A Maximum of 560 points can be shot on a 28 target round. A 3-D Target course is set out by a SANIFAA authorized body to ensure safety and standards are adhered to. Archers then move in groups of 3 or 4 people around the course shooting two arrows



each on the various 28 targets. Each target is accompanied by a target number, photograph of the target being shot and a target group size. The group size helps with the maximum and minimum distance of which the target is placed. This is a big help to the archer and helps to minimize missed and lost arrows. (Who says 3-D Target Archery is difficult). It is not too late come and join us, you might even surprise yourself.

## 3-D Target Range

As with field archery ranges, the actual land area required between the shooting stakes and targets is a small fraction of the total 3-D target range area required. Although the distances shot on a 3-D target range average less than those shot on a field range, there are several factors which make the total area requirements greater:

◆Arrow speed as well as the probability of arrow ricochet are higher for the 3-D archer than for the field archer, and since fabricated backstops are not desired (for the sake of realism), the *safety zones should be at least twice the size suggested for a field range*. Earthen backstops, however, either manmade or natural, will help quite a bit.

◆Paths to and from the target should never be along the sight-line between the shooting stake and target. Again, for realism and fairness to all, more area is required to preserve the natural habitat behind and in front of the target.

◆A 3-D target range is rarely shot the same way twice. That is, either the targets or stakes, or both, are relocated for each tournament.

◆Ideally, the animal targets should be matched with their habitats. If you use a large variety of targets, then you need a large variety of habitats; thus requiring more land area.

In summary, a rough estimate of the land area required for a 3-D target range is 50% more per target than for a field range.

## **INDOOR ARCHERY**

Indoor archery takes place in an indoor facility and is shot over a distance of 20 yards for archers above the age of 13 and at 10 yards for children beneath the age of 13. In Indoor archery the archer has the choice to aim at a 5 spot target or a one spot target. Indoor archery entails 12



rounds of 5 arrows each round with 60 arrows in total for a score of 300. The archer is given 4 minutes to shoot a round of 5 arrows.

Indoor archery is the best archery discipline to start your archery experience, especially children. SANIFAA have currently 70 registered children under the age of 13 that shoots in the cubs style and 75 junior archers who are between the age of 13 to 16. During the past year the SANIFAA Indoor archery discipline has grown to such an extent that Provincial championships have to take place over a period of 2 days to accommodate all the archers. Provincial Championships presently accommodates an average of 120 archers per

tournament where as in the past only 30 to 40 archers attended a tournament. A record amount of 188 archers attended the North Gauteng Provincial Indoor Archery Championships this past weekend at The Bow Shop in Pretoria.

Presently SANIFAA is presenting 13 provincial indoor tournaments per annum that are being hosted all over the country by affiliated clubs. The South African National Indoor Archery Championships are being held annually in the month May and this year 167 archers from all over the country attended this 3 day national tournament.

SANIFAA is in the privileged position to host the 2011 IFAA World Indoor Archery Championships in South Africa which will take place at the Rembrandt Hall of the University of Pretoria Sport Centre during the period 11 to 15 July 2011. This will be first time in the history of archery that an Indoor Archery World Championships will be hosted on the African Continent and in South Africa. This will also be the first time in the history of South Africa that Protea Colours will be awarded to an Indoor Archery Team.



At the 2010 South African National Indoor Archery Championships in May this year, the 2009 SANIFAA Indoor Archer of the Year award was awarded to Monique Howse of the Zoo Lake Archery Club in Johannesburg. This young lady competes with a recurve bow that is very difficult bow to shoot with. Her scores at the National Championships were 286 / 300 and 285 / 300 with a total tournament score of 571 / 600. This is an exceptional score for a lady archer which is a much higher score than her male counterparts. Well done Monique!! Monique has a very good chance to be crowned as the Ladies Freestyle Recurve world champion at the World Indoor Archery Championships next year.

Currently the SANIFAA Indoor Archery discipline is in a healthy condition country wide and is growing in numbers each day. SANIFAA would like to thank all our loyal archers for their support and commitment to the sport of indoor archery. We are looking forward to welcoming you at the next indoor archery tournament.

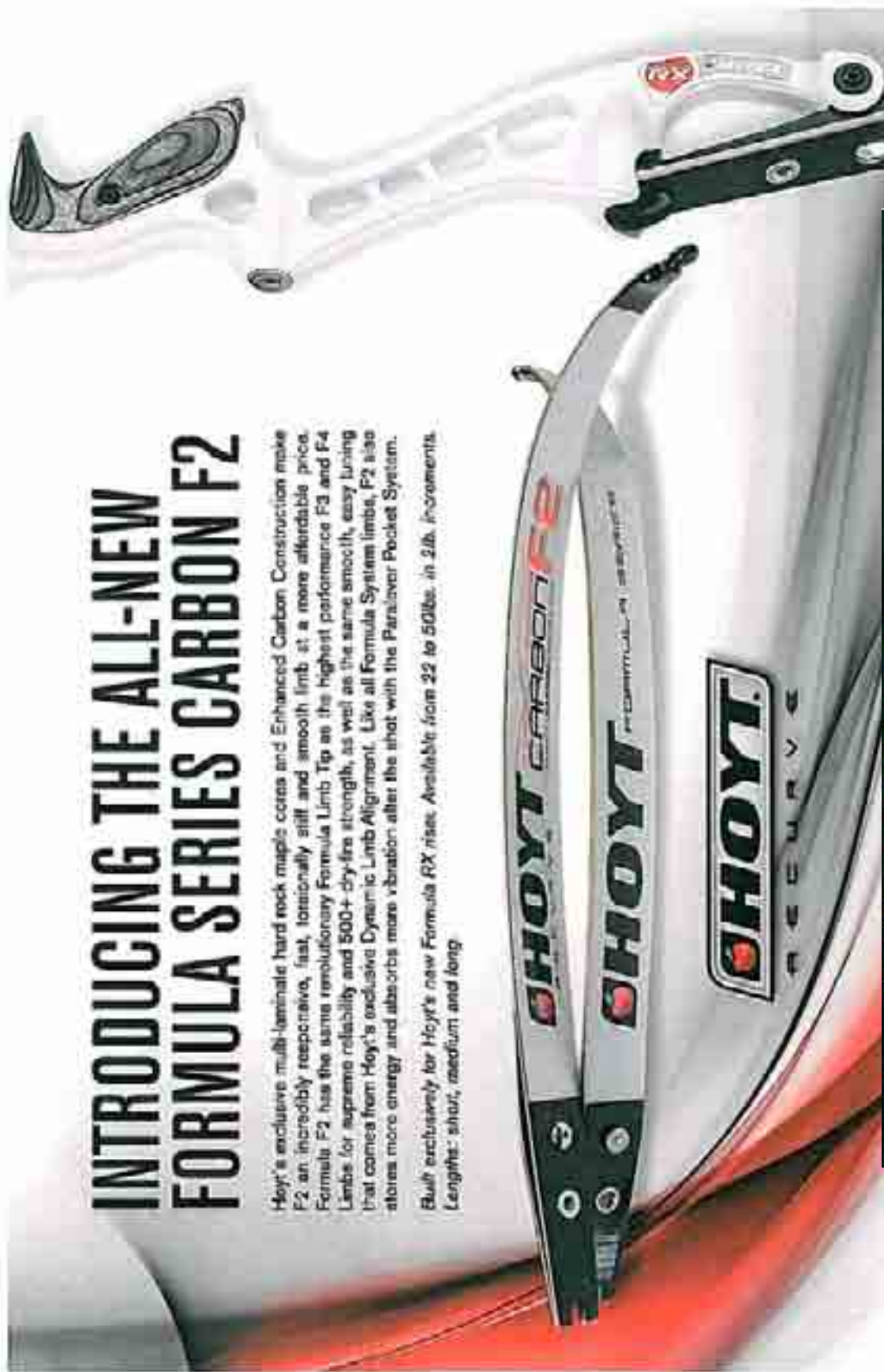

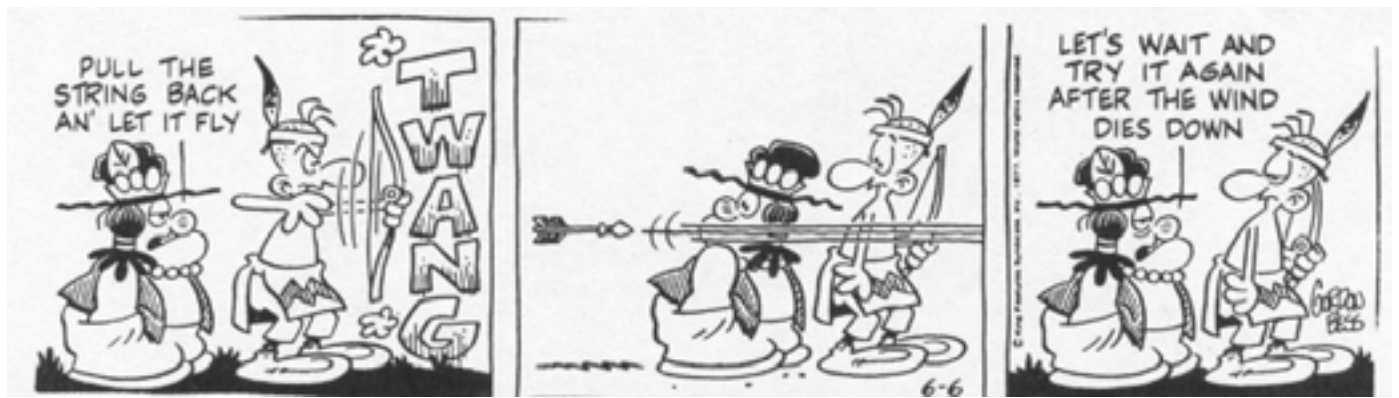

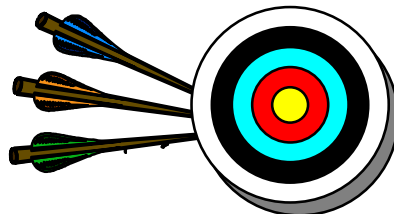
